Canyon Ridge offers sportsman's paradise.


here are few places in the west where millions of acres of unspoiled space still exist ...

"We are providing an opportunity for a small group of people to be a part of a legacy ranch ... to share in its enjoyment, but not in its day-to-day maintenance,"

And for those who would say Canyon Ridge is off the beaten path, the Rare Earth team has wasted no time in providing the highest level of amenities and conveniences.

A lodge will house a full catering kitchen, lounge, dining and entertainment areas. A fitness facility will be available with the latest equipment and treatment rooms. Ranch owners will share in the exclusive use of all available elk, mule deer, turkey and black bear permits issued annually by the New Mexico Fish and Game department for guided hunts inside the conservation easement. Managed trout fishing on miles of creeks, streams, and ponds awaits you. Road construction and other infrastructure are well underway, and the latest in conservation technology will be applied to provide water, utilities, and waste management.

"It is not about what we are doing at Canyon Ridge," says Plant. "It is about what we aren't doing. We are preserving the land, while creating access for a small group of people to an untamed piece of the west."
